1. BRIEF HISTORY OF THE INSTITUTE

The College of Engineering Pathanapuram, one among the nine Govt. Controlled Self Financing Engineering Colleges under the Co-operative Academy of Professional Education, Kerala, which is promoted by the Co-operative Department of the Government of Kerala, was started in the year 2011. The College is affiliated to APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University.

1.1 Land and Location:

An extent of 10.4 hectare of land from the 60 hectare of land comprised in Sv. No. 688/1/1 of Piravanthoor Village under possession of Animal Husbandry Department for setting up an Engineering College. CAPE was permitted to take an advanced possession of the land as per G.O. (Ms.) No. 200/2000/RD dated 30.06.2000. It is located 7 Km away from Pathanapuram and Punalur towns. The nearest railway station is at Punalur which is 8 Km from the College campus.

2.ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

2.1 AICTE Approval:

The AICTE approval of the College of Engineering Pathanapuram for the academic year 2020-21 was accorded by the AICTE as per Order No. F.No. South-West/1-7007165379/2020/EOA dated 30/04/2020.

2.2 University Recognition:

University affiliation to the College of Engineering Pathanapuram for the academic year 2020-21 was accorded by the APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University vide order No. KTU/A/456/2015 dated 02.08.2020.

2.3 Govt. Sanction:

Government has accorded sanction for starting four B.Tech courses as per the G.O (ms) No. 40/10/H.Edn TVM dated 03.03.2010 and one additional course as per the G.O (Rt) No. 281/2017/Co-op dated 30/05/2017.

2.4 ISO certification Process

Surveillance Audit of Certification body was conducted and certificate was issued on 18.12.2020. RIR Certification Pvt Ltd has certified that the Organization Management System is functioning in accordance with the ISO 9001: 2015 standard.

2.5 Working hours:

At the beginning of the semester classes were conducted through online platform from 8.30 am to 1.30 pm. Later on the mode of teaching was switched over to offline as per KTU direction. The number of working days per week was fixed as six as per workload. The office working time is from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all six days except on public holidays declared by the Government.

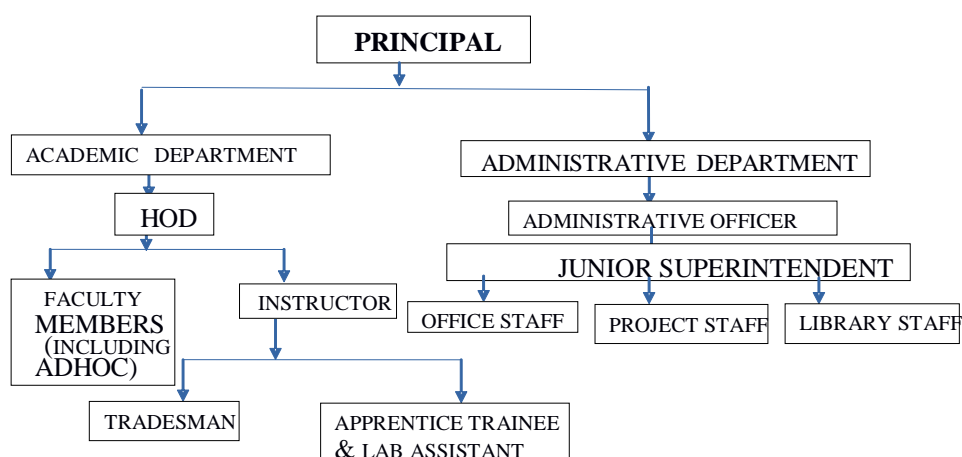
